

Smoke Free Policy

The **Jandakot Jets Junior Football Club (JJJFC)** recognised that passive smoking, (inhaling second-hand smoke) is hazardous to health and that non-smokers should be protected from tobacco smoke, this also includes vaps, e-cigarettes and cigars. Passive smoking can lead to other serious illnesses such as bronchitis, lung cancer, cardiovascular disease, and chest illnesses in children. Accordingly, this policy has been developed by the **Jandakot Jets Junior Football Club** to help protect people's health.

The move to go Smoke Free also complements the **Jandakot Jets Junior Football Club's** desire to create a healthy family friendly environment. The **JJJFC** believes that such an environment and image will be advantageous in attracting new members and positively promoting the club in the community.

Legislation and the legal duty of care also provide reasons to have a Smoke Free club. Under common law the **JJJFC** has a legal duty of care to ensure that employees, volunteers, players, and officials are not exposed to potentially harmful situations. The Occupational Health and Safety Act also stipulates, employees and working volunteers must have a safe environment to work in. Western Australian SmokeFree dining legislation also states that enclosed dining areas must be SmokeFree.

DESIGNATED SMOKEFREE AREAS.

The Jandakot Jets Junior Football Club requires the following areas to be Smoke Free:

- Club and social rooms
- Administration and office areas
- Changing rooms
- Toilet blocks
- Indoor spectator viewing areas
- Playing areas
- Eating areas and canteen
- Grandstands and spectator viewing areas
- Near entries and exits of buildings, facilities, and the ground

WHO IS AFFECTED BY THE POLICY: This policy applies to all members, administrators, officials, coaches, players and visitors of the **Jandakot Jets Junior Football Club**.

TIMING: This policy is effective from 31st January, 2019.

REVIEWED: The JJJFC Committee reviewed this Policy in November, 2021 to ensure currency and alignment with the Club Values and Beliefs.
