Report:	<p>As of July 2022, we currently have 101 girls and 362 boys registered; approximately 10 players cancelled their registrations at some point through the year. I think this is second time that we have cracked the 100 mark for girls, with 105 in 2021, compared to 505 boys. (In 2020 we had 90 girls and 532 boys). All team managers with players at the milestone age groups have been sent lists of games played - the records are fairly good, but there are many exceptions. PlayHQ has not updated all teams beyond July 2021, so games are missing from August and finals if applicable. Some kids are missing games, some appear to have too many. In some cases, a player's statistics only show up on PlayHQ for the 2022 season; the reason being that that person didn't claim their profile during registration. I am away for the next few rounds but have had a training season with Kim Hansen who will be entering the scores and scratching the players who didn't play.</p> <p>thanks</p> <p>Will attach graph with minutes</p>

Report:	<p>5 games to Go with finals and like that the season will be finished.</p> <p>Our Mid-season Coaches review meeting went well for the Junior and Youth Coaches. Some great questions we asked and discussed at the meeting.</p> <p>For the coaches who have not yet been reviewed this will be happening over the next few weeks.</p> <p>Congratulations to Caren Bell for receiving an award from the WAFC on outstanding Female teams coaching Award.</p> <p>With 5 games to go it was reinforced to the Coaches that a good season finish is important and that “E” points count from a club and team perspective. With latter positions in Youth football super important for finals campaigns.</p> <p>It has been reasonably good thus far but need to maintain good behaviour from the coaching staff, Parents and players.</p> <p><u>Game Tallies. (Constitution addition)</u></p> <p>Item – Player game tallies for the club should only be included for either a boys or girls competition and not combined.</p> <p>Example – A female player can play in both a male or female competition up to Y8 and therefore can effectively double the total amount of games played at the club for that period.</p> <p>Whilst not all female players will do this and I would encourage that they do play both cohorts as the development will accelerate their skill level. This mean that potential they will exceed the 150 games tally when other players in the club would not.</p>		

	<p>Less say “Brooke” plays from Y3 to Y8 in both boys and girls cohorts with an average of 12 games a year.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 12 games (Y3 to Y8) x 6 years in boys = 72 games (let’s say they are all injury free). • 12 games (Y3 to Y8) x 6 years in Girls = 72 games (let’s say they are all injury free). <p>Total games over the 6 years is 144 games. If this player continues to play out to say Y11 at 12 games a year potentially they will play another 36 games minimum for the club or 180 games minimum.</p> <p>I think this should be changed in the constitution as the girls competition is a well-established competition now (previously it was not) and all girls have the ability to only play in a single cohort and therefore the club game tally should only be recognised in the one cohort. Unfortunately the male players for obvious reasons are not allowed to play over both cohorts and there are not able to achieve similar game tallies. As per the example the only players that could potentially reach the 150 games tallies after the current Y10 group would be the female player. Not sure this is right moving forward.</p>
